Yovani's Story: Long Term Impact



Yovani's story is a testament to the power of education, perseverance, and a community that believes in the future of Deaf individuals. Born in 2007, Yovani was five years old when he joined the Deaf classroom at Nueva Vida, a school for children with disabilities in Santa María de Jesús, located on the slopes of the dormant Volcán Agua. This Deaf class was started by Roy and his staff, providing Deaf children with something extremely rare in Guatemala—a chance to learn and communicate in a language of their own.

After completing sixth grade, Yovani faced the same challenge many Deaf students Guatemala do: a lack of access to further education. However, two of his teachers at Nueva Vida, Nisza and Manuel, had a vision for something greater. With training language from Roy and one of our Deaf Staff members, they went on to establish an advanced school for hiah school-level education, ensuring that Deaf students like Yovani could continue learning. Today, Yovani is enrolled in this school, thriving in an environment designed to support and challenge him academically.

While our early work involved training teachers to equip Deaf students like Yovani, our primary focus today is reaching Deaf adults who have never had the opportunities he has had. Many Deaf adults in Guatemala have grown up with no schooling, no communication, and no community—isolated and without access to language. Our mission is to redeem these lost years, offering them the gift of communication, a sense of belonging, and the hope of Christ.

This year at The Chosen Camp for the Deaf 2025, Yovani's journey took an even greater step forward. After years of learning and growing, he made the life-changing decision to accept Christ as his Savior. Roy had the privilege of leading him to a saving knowledge of Christ, marking a new chapter in his story. Yovani's testimony is a beautiful reminder that education opens doors, but only Christ brings true transformation.

As we continue to serve the Deaf community in Guatemala, we celebrate Yovani's story while staying focused on our mission—bringing language, education, and the hope of the gospel to Deaf adults who have been left behind.
